Palencia is a cosy and welcoming city which offers extensive cultural, leisure and gastronomic offers throughout the year. Located just 47 km from Valladolid airport on the A62 and just one hour and a quarter from Madrid by AVE, the city is ideally located, connected by a modern rail and road network.

You will be surprised by its extraordinary heritage and monuments of great beauty, such as its impressive Cothic cathedral, which has its origins in the 7th century Visigothic Crypt, the Church of San Miguel, with its famous fortified tower, where, according to tradition, Rodrigo Díaz de Vivar "El Cid" and Doña Jimena were married, or the Cristo del Otero (Christ of the Knoll), the tallest in Spain.

Palencia is also a health-conscious city that will invite you to sit back and relax. It is considered one of the greenest cities in Spain, with a multitude of parks, some of which are located along the banks of the river Carrión, where you will be amazed by the bridges that cross it: the Puentecillas bridge, which dates back to Roman times, the Puente Mayor and Puente de Hierro. Discover the Calle Mayor, Palencia's main artery; almost 1 km long, it is ideal for strolling, shopping and observing the variety of buildings of different styles and periods.

The history of Palencia is very much marked by the pre-Roman period. The arrival of the Vacceans to the area, in the 2nd century B.C., gave the city its name, Pallantia, the remains of which can be seen in the Museum of Palencia. However, it was with Alfonso VIII when Palencia enjoyed its period of splendour, with the foundation of the first Spanish university (Studium Generale) at the beginning of the 13th century.

The province of Palencia is also home to a wealth of heritage sites, nature reserves and gastronomic delights that will make your event even more unique.

The city has incredible connections by road, for both cars or buses, and by train, which will take you to the capital in just 1 hour and 36 minutes with Alvia.

From abroad, the easiest way to get there is by taking a plane to Madrid. Salamanca is also close to Matacán airport, which at certain times of the year offers charter and scheduled flights to various Spanish and European cities.

Business tourism represents an increasingly large potential market in Salamanca. Its size, its convenient accesses, its commitment to modernity, its excellent infrastructures and its modern and varied hotel offer are the best reasons to choose the city when holding a congress, convention or incentive trip.

At present, Salamanca can accommodate up to 6,500 people. Among the venues for events, the Conference and Exhibition Centre of Salamanca, located in the historic centre of the city, has a total of 17 rooms, including the Sala Mayor with a capacity for 1,063 people, the Sala Menor with a capacity for 398 people and an exhibition area of more than 1,000 m2. The building has great versatility as its spaces can host from small meetings to large events.

Among the unique spaces for hosting events are the Art Nouveau Art Dèco Museum, Casa Lis and the Automotive History Museum.

Salamanca's historical and cultural heritage is complemented by another attraction, its gastronomy, which will provide authentic gastronomic experiences.

The city is an ideal destination for work, but it also offers a wide range of leisure opportunities. If you want to step outside the city, visit the Campo Charro, the Iberian ham factories and try the many nature activities that the countryside has to offer.

The city has 16 different accommodations ranging from three to five star hotels with a capacity of 1,014 rooms. This proximity allows for quick and smooth transfers, which helps with the logistics of any meeting.

Segovia is one of the most important gastronomic destinations in Spain. A good example of this is the 13,405 available seats in the city's bars and restaurants. Soria is located in a privileged position, between important Spanish cities such as Zaragoza, Valladolid, Logroño, Pamplona and Madrid, to which it is linked by motorway, and which can be reached in just 2 hours.

The city itself is small, making it ideal to discover on foot and for MICE tourism. Clean, safe, hospitable and with culture as its hallmark, it offers unique heritage sites such as the chapel of San Saturio, the church of Santo Domingo or the monastery of San Juan de Duero. Praised by poets such as Machado, Bécquer or Gerardo Diego, its rich gastronomy is famous for its mushrooms, butter and bacon. The Duero river, which flows by the city, provides an exceptional natural environment a stone's throw from the city centre.

Soria counts with a wide range of modern catering establishments and restaurants that can seat over 6,000 people. It also offers complete facilities for conferences and events such as the Palacio de la Audiencia Cultural Centre, the Alameda Cultural Space, the Gaya Nuño Cultural Centre and the Aula Magna Tirso de Molina.

And as an ideal complement to this MICE tourism, the region offers an extensive and varied province full of places to visit. Places such as Almazán, El Burgo de Osma, Berlanga de Duero, Medinaceli, Ágreda, or jewels of our past such as the hermitage of San Baudelio, the monastery of Santa María de Huerta, the castle of Cormaz or the site of Numancia. It also has an enormous diversity of landscapes, from the enormous pine and beech forests of the Sierra de Urbión, to the holly groves of the Highlands, the savin groves of the moors, the holm oak forests of the Moncayo or the vine kingdom of the Ribera del Duero, and natural spaces of great value such as the Laguna Negra or the canyon of the River Lobos.

Myco-gastronomic tourism, the guided routes of the poets or the Celtiberian experience, taking part in the "Soria Castronomic" Congress, the Enclave de Agua Festival or the Noche de las Ánimas (Night of the Souls) are some of the unique proposals to be carried out in Soria, which is, and always has been, a place for gatherings.

Valladolid is a large city, characterised by its economic dynamism, rich history, important cultural activities, urban expansion and good transport links. Capital of the autonomous community of Castilla y León, it is geographically located in the centre of the northern sub-plateau, just 190 km from Madrid.

Only 55 minutes from Madrid by train, with more than 20 daily train connections with AVE, ALVIA or AVANT services. With direct connections to the interior of Castilla y León, Galicia, Asturias, Cantabria and the Basque Country, as well as to cities such as Alicante, Barcelona, Lisbon and Paris.

The International Airport, located just 10 km from the capital, offers direct connections to Barcelona, Seville, and the Canary and Balearic Islands.

In Valladolid, there are all kinds of venues. The Miguel Delibes Cultural Centre has an auditorium with a capacity for 1,700 people. The Feria de Valladolid Congress Centre can host everything from major trade fairs to small meetings for up to 600 people. The Conde Ansúrez Congress Centre, the Calderón de la Barca Theatre, and the Laboratorio de las Artes. In addition to these, there is the charming auditorium of the Science Museum and the San Agustín Cultural Centre.

Castles, wineries, monasteries, theatres, auditoriums, all of them perfectly equipped, complete the options offered to host any type of congress
